Spotlight on the Learning Hub

The Learning Hub is a learning support service provided by Student and Library Services in partnership with the University's Schools. It provides a range of approaches for learning including <u>online support guides</u>, <u>tutorials</u> and <u>workshops</u> on subjects such as critical writing, proofreading, writing in the third person and being concise.

Sue Myer and Yvonne Cotton from the Learning Hub (pictured above) continue to support your students in these challenging times. We offer one-to-one tutorials via Teams or email to help students develop their academic writing or academic skills.

We recognise that the most helpful support often comes from other students who can see a situation through student eyes. We manage both group-based peer support through PASS (Peer Assisted Study Skills) and individual support through a pilot buddying scheme.

PASS 2021/22

PASS is an internationally recognised scheme whereby volunteer students are trained to mentor and guide students in lower years to support their learning through weekly study sessions. PASS leaders use a variety of techniques to facilitate the group to talk about any areas that are unclear and to enable the group to support each other.
