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Overview

Teesside University provides a suite of developmental programmes for researchers at all stages of their career. All our activities support the [UK Concordat to Support the Career Development of Researchers](#) and are aligned to [Vitae's Researcher Development Framework](#).

As well as bitesize sessions we also have a number of intensive programmes to fast-track your research career. It is recommended that all researchers participate in the session Research Career Planning.

Our Approach

Our programmes take a blended approach to learning, with courses consisting of independent e-learning, webinars, peer mentoring, and guided tasks. Through an immersive approach to training and development, participants will be provided with **a lively and supportive learning environment that encourages them to think and reflect on their own experiences and to develop new approaches, skills, and behaviours**. Peer-to-peer learning is a central to our offer and is important in ensuring continued and sustainable learning for participants through the sharing of expertise, knowledge, and feedback.

Our Offer

FOR ALL RESEARCHERS (from PhD to Professor), we have two programmes to support your professional development:

- The **Research and Enterprise Essentials Programmes** consists of short bite size webinars to introduce you to new topics and resources. The programme includes sessions on: research induction, research ethics, careers and professional development, and research leadership.
- The **Research Methods and Design Programme** provides advice on research design, methods and methodologies, as well as guidance and support for interdisciplinary and collaborative working.

In addition to the above we also host a range of regular events and activities. These include:

- monthly writing bootcamps to support thesis, publication and grant writing
- online research funding cafes providing guidance on the latest calls and developments in research
- seminars on specialist topics and areas of interest

FOR EARLY CAREER RESEARCHERS, we have three application-based online programmes to help you focus on a particular pathway and to fast-track your professional development:

- **Securing Research Funding**
- **Realising Research Impact**

FOR MIDDLES CAREER RESEARCHERS, our application-based **MCR ELEVATE Programme** supports researchers to take the next steps in their career providing support on collaboration, leadership, profile raising, and building a research team.

FOR SENIOR CAREER RESEARCHERS, we offer a tailored and targeted **Research Leadership Roundtable** consisting of a series of expert workshops to support you in leading a research group, team, or Centre.

FOR POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH DEGREE SUPERVISORS, we have designed a comprehensive programme to provide you with all the information you need to navigate TU processes and procedures and deliver high quality, effective, and responsible research supervision.

REALISING RESEARCH IMPACT

This **Realising Research Impact Programme** will introduce participants to research impact and support them with developing personalised impact plans and delivering high quality engagement and enterprise activities. By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- situate their research within a wider civic, social and economic context
- evidence and articulate their research impact
- take a strategic, inclusive and responsible approach to research impact
- design effective engagement and enterprise activities
- determine the value of their research and identify opportunities for adoption and take up.
- apply concepts of intellectual property (including copyright, trademarks, designs and patents) to their research portfolio
- adapt their research to difference audiences including the wider public, policymakers, and business.

MIDDLE CAREER ELEVATE PROGRAMME
